To increase the number of grants requested and provide access to available funds more frequently, we launched the CEF Mini-Grant Program at the beginning of the 2018/2019 school year. By the end of the 2018/2019 school year, the Education Foundation had awarded \$346,242.57 total in grants since its inception.


