Future Focus Lunch & Learn

The Calallen Education Foundation wanted to expand its reach and incorporate student engagement and input into the Foundation's initiatives. We provide wonderful resources for our teachers, based on their requests, but what about the kids? What do they need?

At the beginning of the 2021/2022 school year, the Calallen High School students were provided an online survey. Nearly 700 students responded to the survey and a small group volunteered to work on a focus group. During that focus group we discussed the results of the survey, outlined possible initiatives, and identified possible action plans.

Over and over the feedback from the survey was a resounding "more information about careers, college, and life skills". Working with the students, and approved by the high school administration, the Future Focus Lunch & Learn Program was created.

The first and third Thursday of each month during all three lunch periods a guest speaker from our community was identified and invited to talk with the students about topics important to the students. These topics would help them find a focus for their future after high school and beyond.

Standard Grants

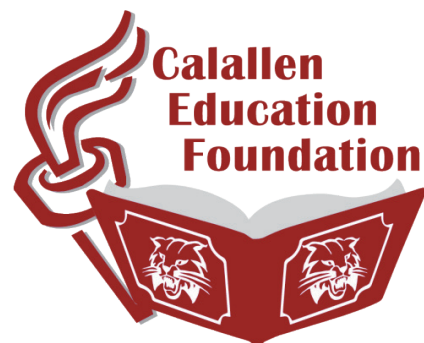

ME by the SEa Conference

A grant was awarded for the registration fees for 10 Calallen ISD STEM educators to attend the ME by the SEa Conference at Texas A & M University Corpus Christi on June 18, 2022. The ME by the SEa Conference is a premier regional professional development of Mathematics, Science, and STEM Education in the Coastal Bend. The annual conference provides educators with teaching strategies and new innovative approaches for students from pre-k through college-level. The presentations/workshops feature hands-on activities teachers can use in the classroom.

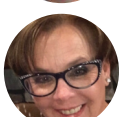

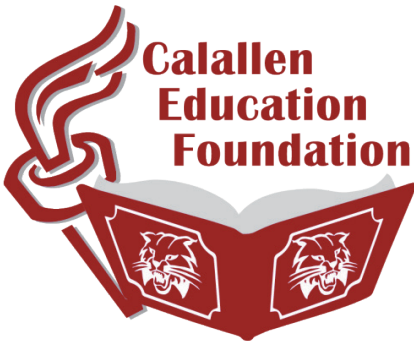


All In For Kids Donors were invited to take a picture with their yard signs to be shared on social media, demonstrating their commitment to innovative education at Calallen ISD.

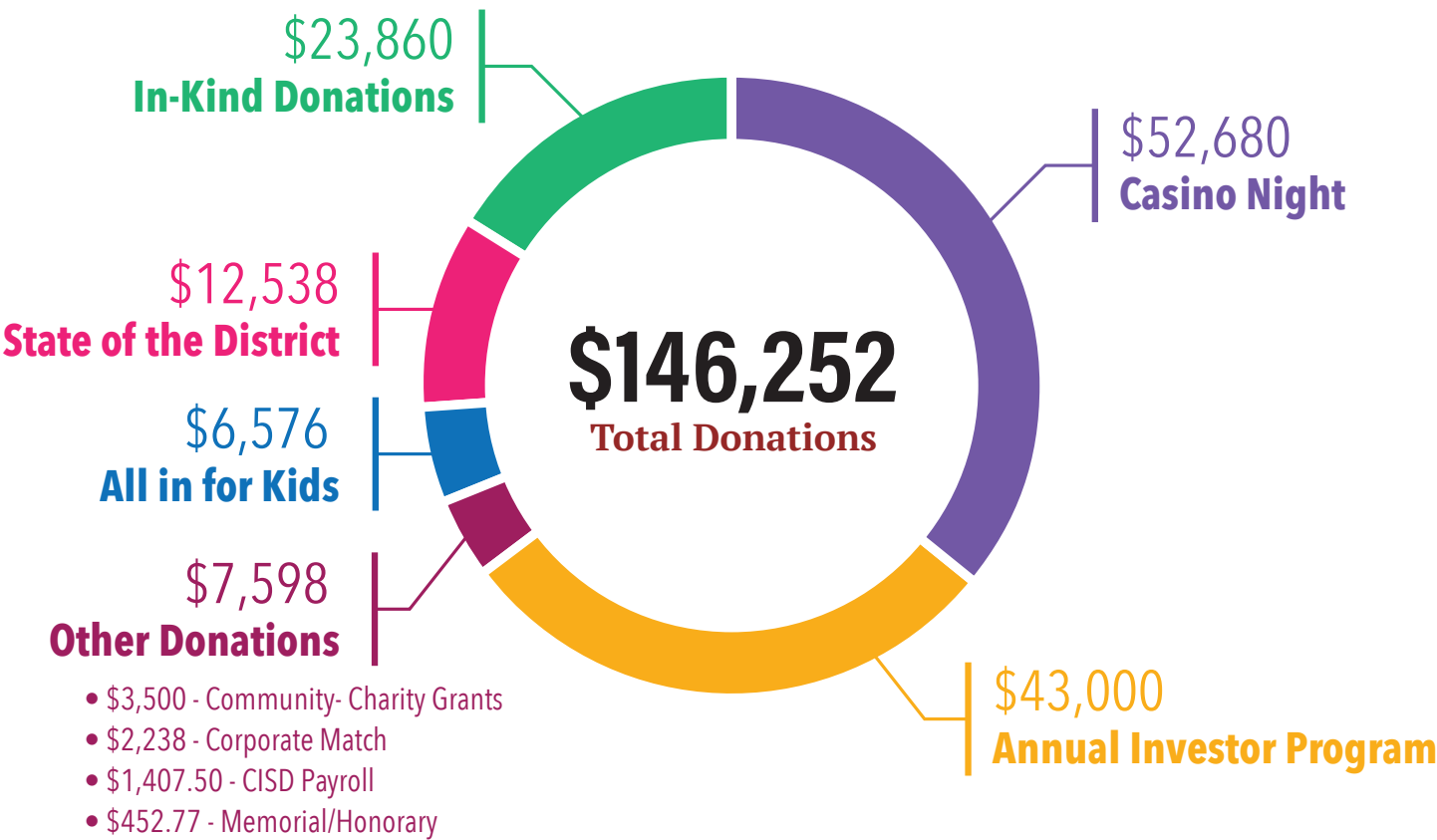
