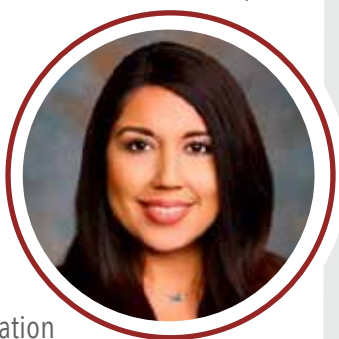

2019 STATE OF THE DISTRICT LUNCHEON

Major Doran serves in the U.S. Marines and pilots Air Force One. He spoke of his time at Calallen and the great impact it had on him. He shared stories about his career and experiences since leaving high school. He captivated the crowd and certainly made a "lasting impression."



Luncheon guests were able to explore Grant Winner displays and enjoy music by the Calallen Steel Band. Mrs. Kate Lopez addressed the crowd with brief comments about the impact her grants have made and Dr. Artie Almendarez was featured in a video that provided an update on Calallen ISD. The program was supported by several Calallen student groups and grant winners as well. Overall, it was a wonderful time of fellowship and celebration.

We got really lucky by scheduling our annual Casino Night on Saturday, February 22, 2020, which was a few weeks earlier in the year than usual. Because of that date, the event was held right before Covid-19 restrictions hit the Calallen community. Our donors and supporters came out for a night of fun and Casino Night held at Al Amin Shrine did not disappoint! Alan Harwell was our Master of Ceremonies and Allen Law was our Auctioneer for the live auction. They did a great job of keeping the crowd engaged and entertained. The silent auction was held online and created the competitive edge that Calallen loves. Once again, we achieved record fundraising levels to support innovative education at Calallen ISD.



GRANT PROGRAMS

2019/2020 was a year for all time success and that is certainly true with the grants that were distributed. In all, 24 major grants were issued totaling \$111,057.55 and 12 mini-grants were issued totaling \$5,313.60.

STANDARD GRANTS

This was the first year that we were able to provide two standard grant cycles for the educators. The first was held in the fall right after they returned from the summer break. The second was held in the spring with our typical February 1 deadline. While our deadline was the same, we were not able to deliver the Spring Grants in our typical Grant Patrol, due to Covid restrictions. So, CEF Board Members created videos with a message to each grant winner informing them of their grant. It was a great way to celebrate and we were able to use the videos on social media as well.

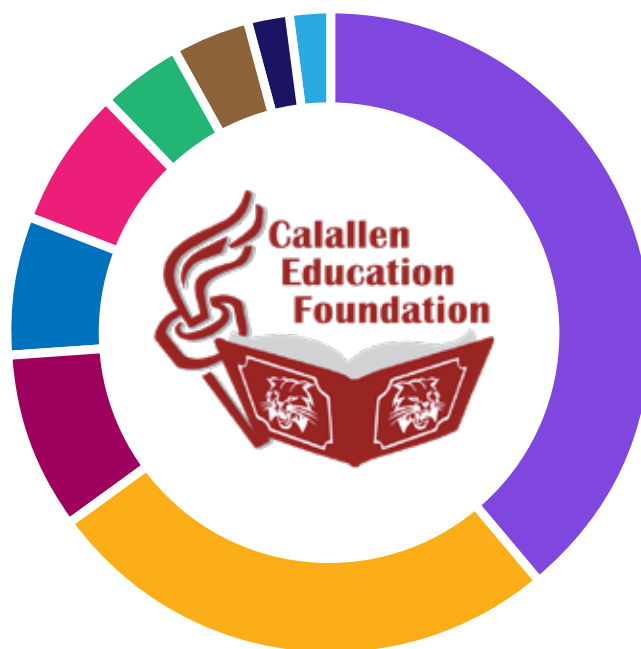
